



## Marillion - Somewhere In London

Brit proggers live, in rehearsal, and more

Marillion are one of Britain's most perpetually underrated and misrepresented bands, their live shows demonstrating their virtuoso prowess, while their music has – surprise, surprise – constantly progressed since Fish's departure over 20 years ago. So, for all those who've been too lazy or prejudiced to sample the Marillion of now, this release provides the ideal opportunity to see what all the fuss should be about, and why Steve Hogarth and chaps should be mentioned in the same breath as Porcupine Tree et al.

Disc One takes in 15 tracks from their recent catalogue, as recorded at London's Kentish Town Forum in June 2007. While much of the material here is less out-and-out hard rocking than on previous outings, there's all the majesty and beauty of the likes of Somewhere Else and Neverland. Disc Two gathers seven classics, the tour de force *Afraid Of Sunlight* and full-on *Sugar Mice* complementing five Racket Club Rehearsal live tracks from April 2007 (including a repeat of *Estonia*). Finally, there are four stunning 5.1 Surround Sound mixes, rounding out an impressive package by an impressive band.
