DVD Review: James Brown – Double Dynamite

James Brown was called the Godfather of Soul for as far back as I can remember. He was performing right up to his sudden death on Christmas Day 2006. He was considered a true legend in his time and a major figure in the development of both soul and funk music.

On this two disc set titled *James Brown – Double Dynamite* James Brown was at the height of his considerable powers when the two sensational performances featured on this DVD set were filmed. The first show was recorded in 1980 at Manhattan's ultra-fashionable Studio 54 at the time a disco Mecca for nightlife preeners took over and you couldn't get in if your face didn't fit or you weren't on the right guest list.

The second featured show captures James Brown on his home turf in 1985 in Atlanta at the Chastain Park Stadium.

Between both DVD's music such as *"Please, Please, Please"*, *"Papa's Got A Brand New Bag"*, and *"It's a Man's, Man's*, Man's World" with a sprinkling of recent songs thrown in for good measure. Brown does his version of *"Georgia On My Mind"* which is almost as good as Ray Charles's version.

With the extras included and the detailed career and track notes in its accompanying lavishly-illustrated booklet, this DVD package is a fitting testament to his genius and a must-have for all fans of the Godfather, both old and new alike.
