



HISTORY ON MY ARMS with Dee Dee Ramone (DVD) (MVD Visual)

Director Lech Kowalski has compiled a treasure trove of footage and interviews with the infamous Dee Dee Ramone that is sure to get the attention of die hard Ramones fans, or any fan of rock and roll and the early days of punk. After putting together the documentary film, "Hey is Dee Dee Home?", Kowalski realized that he had so much great extra footage that really captured the true spirit of Dee Dee and the energy he emitted, that it would be a shame not to share it with the rest of us. Thus, "History on My Arms" came into fruition. The title comes from a line in the movie when Dee Dee is referring to his tattoos and tract marks as history. It's funny because there is also a bit with Vom Ritchie, with a totally different account of how things went down with the legendary rockers, yet both are very believable and sincere. Of course there is the original documentary "Hey is dee Dee Home?", which presents a clean and sober Dee Dee pouring his heart out to the camera in a fantastic display of realism.
