New documentary portrays the tour that never ends by Bob Dylan

You're going to get on another tour again, a virtually tied with the next, "says journalist Adrian Deevoy." Oh, that's all the same tour, "Bob Dylan corrected." Is it the never-ending tour? "Asks Deevoy, which the singer replied "yes." It was this interview, published in the British magazine Q in 1989, which inadvertently christened the emblematic series of concerts of the musician of Minnesota.

The "Neverending Tour" has had a Bob Dylan and his band on stage almost continuously since 1988. One of them decided to take a camera and capture part of this tour. Drummer Winston Watson was the guest artist for over five years and has given 400 concerts with him.

Watson recorded by the documentary is titled "Neverending tour diaries" and goes on sale next April 7. The DVD, released by MVD Visual and Highway 61 Entertainment, takes time-related concerts, such as life on the road next to the legendary musician, tests, binding to Dylan's band and also the separation of families from the time of .

He also remembers the legendary performances at Woodstock 1994 and the MTV Unplugged 1995. It also has special guests like Bruce Springsteen, George Harrison, Neil Young, The Rolling Stones, Santana, The Grateful Dead and Van Morrison.
