MVD Visual The brand new DVD featuring country-based artist T.G. Sheppard in a 10-song performance from the Church Street Station achieves a few different things. The first thing it achieves is that it makes you really miss the old Nashville Network (TNN) where things like this would originally air. It isn't that often that a stripped down performance is broadcasted live these days unless you are watching the Grand Ole Opry. The other main accomplishment that this DVD has comes after TG's performance where they also feature a young Stella Parton, along with Vegas entertainer Carme and Becky Hobbs, but it is obviously Sheppard as the main attraction. His music, for those that have never heard it, isn't really your typical country. He combines a big band sound with country roots as you will see when his band plays an instrumental version of the classic Alabama hit "Mountain Music," but Sheppard's biggest hits are here as well including "Last Cheaters Waltz" and "Only One You." This is a great look back at country before it became what it is today. This performance takes place in an intimate setting and features TG doing what he does best, performing his songs with an unmatched passion. If you are a bit older than this will be a trip down memory lane for you and is well worth a look.
