### Shaun Ryder

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Black Grape It's Great When You're Straight...Yeah 2CD/DVD, with 17 bonuses, nine videos, is on Universal, 4 November. RC asked Shaun Ryder what else is on the cards? "Myself and Kermit [Leveridge, of Black Grape] are at Youth's studio in Spain from late September for a new album. Lots of testosterone."

# Is there anything unissued in the archive?

I have an SWR album produced by Sunny Levine that I can't wait to get out, but with the new Black Grape and a Happy Mondays album planned for 2018, I'm not sure when. That's up to Alan McGee.

Who would you like to remix?

Johnny motherfucking Cash. It'd be mind-blowing fucking about with those bass lines, guitar licks and moody tunes. What was your favourite record shop

#### when you started out?

SCAN supermarket, Salford, early 70s. It had a huge record department and jukebox, and I shoved singles under my coat, plus *Hunky Dory, Pin Ups* and Rod's *Every Picture Tells A Story*, into the lining of my specially-adaptedto-rob Parker.

What's the last record that you bought? Dean Martin's Greatest Hits. Was anyone in your family

#### a musician?

My dad can play anything, though banjo, accordion and double-bass put food on the table.

What's the oddest place in which you've had inspiration for a song?

In the middle of a shoot-out between police and yardies in Jamaica. It went off like a firework – the song was Yeah Yeah Brother. Which band would you most like to have been in?

The Beach Boys. Not only would I be dressed really cool with a great haircut, I'd have a fucking amazing singing voice.

Of all the people you've worked with, who taught you the most? Mrs Orville Wyss, my piano teacher, who taught me to develop my ear training. What fact about you may surprise
