# DVD Documents Legendary Rock Album

## Guns N' Roses film delves into the making of Use Your Illusion I and II.

In 1991 Guns N' Roses was already established as the biggest band on the music scene and did something that never had been done before. They released two albums made exclusively of studio material in the same day.

The DVD documentary "Use Your Illusion 1&2," reveals how the two "Use Your Illusion" albums had to be something that rock fans had to have.

Nevertheless everything really began for the group with their first electric album, "Appetite for Destruction," which met huge success and was a novelty in the history of rock 'n' roll.

The film takes an in-depth look at the making of the albums, "Use Your Illusion 1&2," and the men behind it. The DVD is narrated through the testimonies of people working in the music industry, on the radio, on TV, as well as writers and the people who had experienced the release and the tour which followed.

The DVD illustrates how each member had his place in the band and how the departure of just one member changed the entire dynamic.

The documentary shows the story of the members and the relationships that linked them.

The film shows how Axl Rose built up his place as the leader of the band by letting himself express his character and his talent, and the consequences this status lead to in the group.

The DVD reveals the vitality of the group and the birth of some songs, which weren't written to become hits, but finally did on their own account. The decline of the group is also overviewed, with discussions of other bands like Metallica or Nirvana, or the excessiveness of Rose's behavior.

Some additional footage includes the band's concerts. During one performance, Axl Rose jumped into the audience and attacked a fan who was recording the show with a video camera. The crowd destroyed thousands and thousands of dollars of material and by the time the concert was over, dozens of people were injured.
