



All My Loving DVD (\$19.95)

This 1968 BBC documentary was ostensibly about the rock revolution of the day, with interviews and performance footage of The Beatles, Jimi Hendrix, The Who, Pink Floyd, Cream, Donovan, Frank Zappa and Eric Burdon of The Animals. But the way it dramatically interwove newsreel images of combat atrocities and the roiling unrest of the times made it too hot to handle in the United States, and it was never shown in America. Now available for the consumer market for the first time, it's a swirling, sometimes shocking look at a moment when music co-existed with mayhem and rock stars were becoming a formidable force with which the world was just learning how to reckon.
