A rare concert for German television in 1978, a classic period in Martyn's career.

Description:

This concert film of a John Martyn performance for German television in 1978 features four songs from that recent album (Big Muff, Small Hours, Certain Surprise and Couldn't Love You More) alongside older material from albums such as Solid Air (Solid Air, May You Never and I'd Rather Be The devil), Bless The Weather (Bless The Weather, Glistening Glyndebourne and Singin' In The Rain) and Sunday's Child(One Day Without You). Filmed during a classic period in Martyn's career, this DVD will be welcomed by his massive fan base. He also continues to tour on a regular basis.

Comments:

Lasting nearly 80 minutes, this is a very good quality, color DVD release of performances from a March 17, 1978, concert in Hamburg, Germany, originally filmed for the German popular music TV program Rockpalast. The sound is very good and there is a very much "live" feel to this concert. For avid guitar fans in general, and for Martyn fans in particular, the chief pleasure might be the opportunity to watch his guitar technique up-close, whether in his nimble (and mostly acoustic) picking or his more idiosyncratic use of his feet to produce Echoplex effects.
