commissioned was released. In an article titled, Dementia Risk Seen in Players in N.F.L. Study, in the New York Times, September 29, 2009, Alan Schwarz reported that "Alzheimer's disease or similar memory-related diseases appear to have been diagnosed in the league's former players vastly more often than in the national population - including a rate of 19 times the normal rate for men ages 30 through 49."

The growing awareness about brain injury, dementia and Alzheimer's as it pertains to playing in the NFL gives hope to many ex-players that help might be on the way. And perhaps a better assistance program will be in place for the players of today when their playing days are done - despite perception, most NFL players are not making millions.
