"In an era when music lovers seem to be required to like one thing, one style, one genre, we get the protean of the Julian Taylor Band – confident enough in their own abilities to delimit the genres and let the soulful beats resound from wider horizons." These words from acclaimed Toronto poet Robert Priest beautifully encapsulate the Julian Taylor Band's double LP, Desert Star, an opus reflecting Toronto's rich musical tapestry that blends vintage soul, rock, roots, and a touch of hip-hop.

Taylor himself describes Desert Star as modern rhythm and blues: deep grooves, powerful horns, and just the right amount of pop smarts. A relatively straightforward formula, yes, but Taylor ultimately envisioned the album as four distinct parts, stemming from sessions at various Toronto studios with producers Saam Hashemi, Bill Bell, Brian Moncarz, and David Engle.

Its original 2016 launch in Canada spawned the summer hit with "Set Me Free" on CBC Radio 2, peaking at #2. This was followed by "Fever," which became a top ten on CBC, peaking at #9. This success seeped into the USA, south of the border, where "Hear Good Things" hit #50 on Active Rock, and "Just a Little Bit" made its way to #88 on the US Top 40.

Four years afer its initial release in North America, Desert Star found its way on to the BBC 2 playlist, and opened up the record for a second life with OJ Borg, presenter of BBC Radio 2's weekday overnight programme cooing "Ahh, man I love that. That's the sort of vibe I'm talking about--extremely good. I love this song, it is, for me, one of the songs of the moment."

He was followed by colleague Steve Wright, who while singing along to the chorus gushed "Great atmosphere there. I like the attention to detail and urgency in this song by the Julian Taylor band. It's good, isn't it." These regular plays were followed by endoresements from still more BBC DJs, including Ken Bruce and Jeremy Vine.

Streaming and record sales enjoyed a noticeable bump in the summer of 2020, and in order to take advantage of this new awareness Aporia organized a UK publicity campaign that saw the servicing of over 150 key press outlets. Several have followed up with interview requests including R'n'R Mag and Blues in Britain.

A single, "Set Me Free," will be released on February 5th in anticipation of a UK-wide digital re-release of Desert Star for March 26th, both to be supported with ongoing publicity efforts and facebook/instagram ads.
