"Building on the first percussive installment, Abstract Latin Lounge II continues Nite Grooves/King Street Sounds' late-night exploration into abstract urban beats – this time, on a smoother, more chilled-out ride. As the first Abstract Latin Lounge proved, it's the musical genres evolving on the fringes of club culture - from acid jazz to downtempo house, and ambient to funky electronica - that are continuing to define the after-hours sound today. Since the late '80s, house music has been clubland's quintessential after-hours sound, and Montreal veteran Julius Papp's uplifting "A Thousand Years" offers glimmers of lost optimism, drawn from wellsprings of feeling and deep house grooves. NYC's old-school Latin house DJ/producer Lord G adds his synthesizer-charged take on Malawi Rocks' version of Incognito's dance classic "Spanish Hustle," featuring Japan's seminal ska band for over a decade, Tokyo Ska Paradise Orchestra. Rounding out the grooves under his Ananda Project moniker, the prolific and ever-versatile Chris Brann (aka Wamdue Project, Wamdue Kidz, and P'taah) injects a neck-jerking, nasty funk to the house beauty "Tone Therapy," which sounds like Daft Punk slipped off their robot suits, knocked back a couple of valium and busted the bodyrock in the jacuzzi. In the '90s, acid jazz became the cornerstone of lounge music, and Japanese acid jazz vanguard Mondo Grosso brings his exuberant, stylish flair to this collection with "Life," featuring Brazilian funky soul chanteuse Paula Lima wrapping her silky vocal chords against the track's mammoth drum kick. Flipping genres for a moment, NYC house music veteran Joe Claussell collaborates with deep house producers Kerri Chandler and Jerome Sydenham on "Escravos de Jo," a stunning marvel of jazz improvisation that lets a brassy horn confidently steer Latin rhythms through a scorching guitar syncopation. Finally, plucked straight from his latest Mix The Vibe series, longtime Brooklyn-based dance music producer Frankie Feliciano adds his soulful touch to a smoldering acapella version of Myra's house classic "Come To Me."- Taken from album liner notes written by Janet Tzou.
